
We are going to Brazil


- What animals did you see in the story? Can you point to an animal in the picture when you adult says an animal name?

- Can you use colouring pens/pencils/crayons or paints to make marks/colour in pictures of animals from the story?








































































Brazillian Lemonade/Limonada Suíça






- 1. Pre-heat oven, prepare mini-muffin tin: Preheat oven to 400°F. Spread a small amount olive oil around the insides of each well of a mini-muffin tin.
- 2. Mix all of the ingredients, except the cheese, together. You can use a blender, if you have one.
- 3. Grate and add the cheese to the mixture, giving everything a good mix.
- 4. Pour the mixture into mini-muffin tin.
- **5.** Bake: Bake at 400°F in the oven for 15-20 minutes, until all puffy and nicely browned. Remove from oven and let cool on a rack for a few minutes.
- 6. Enjoy!






