






- 1. Show your child the flag from Indian. What colours can you see?

- 5. What other writing materials can you use to decorate the flag? Can you use paint or stick on coloured paper/materials?













Jungle and Rainforest I Spy and Add to 20


1. Pupils to make playdough (2 cups flour,	³ ⁄ ₄ cup of salt, 2 cups warm water, 2
tablespoons of vegetable oil, food colouring	g)



- 4. To extend pupils learning please encourage them to make their own creations e.g. making a tiger






Draw an Elephant

2. Encourage your child to explore the sensory materials and ice referencing the Himalayan mountains.


3. Encourage your child to find the animals in the sensory media and name them.


4. You can extend the activity by encouraging your child to count how many animals they can find, write the names of the animals they can find.



Sensory learning- Spice painting

1. Fill pot up to halfway with water, add 1tsp of spice to a pot and mix using paintbrush. Do this for all the spices you want to use.

2. Using symbols below name each of the spices encouraging your child to smell/ taste.


3. Encourage your child to make mark/ draw patterns and pictures with the paintbrushes on their paper.

4. When finished leave to dry, once dry encourage your child to feel and smell their artwork.

5. Can your child's writing skills by asking them to use their paint brush to create lines/ curves and write words.

1.Introduce the national bird of India (peacock).


2. watch video of the peacock opening feathers. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=qDvFdj-pFMc


- 3. Identify the different colours of the bird and explore feathers (if you have them).








Research project

Cooking - Chicken or vegetable curry



1. Follow recipe below to make chicken curry (can use vegetables if vegetarian)

2. Encourage your child to make the curry as independently as possible working on life skills such as cutting and using a knife safely.

3. Support your child to complete the activity from start to finish- preparation through to washing up

pepper, paprika, coriander,
cinnamon1 tin of coconut milk

Recipe for chicken curry

Add 500g of chicken/ vegetables to bowl

Add spices (1tsp of each- garlic, ginger, curry powder, fenugreek, cumin, salt, pepper, paprika, coriander, cinnamon)

Add tin of tomato

Chop onions and add to bowl

Shake coconut milk and add to bowl

Add vegetable stock to 500ml of boiling water

Mix all ingredients and pour into frying pan

Cook for 20 minutes or until ingredients are ready

Serve with microwave rice
