1. Cut your coloured paper into different pieces. (If you don't have coloured paper, you can use colouring pencils/pens to colour in plain paper or make patterns).





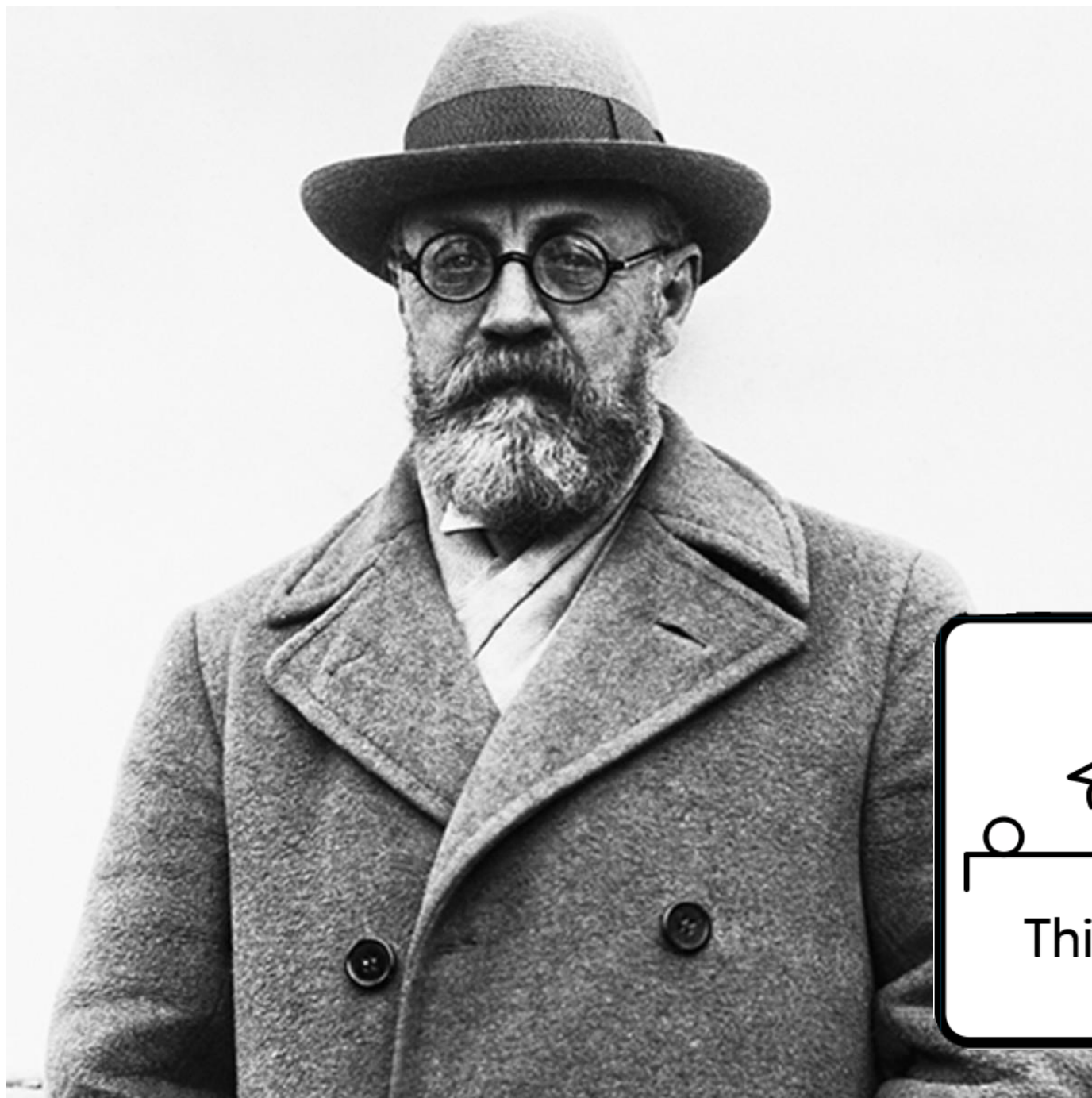
Resources you will need

3. Repeat until you are happy with your design.

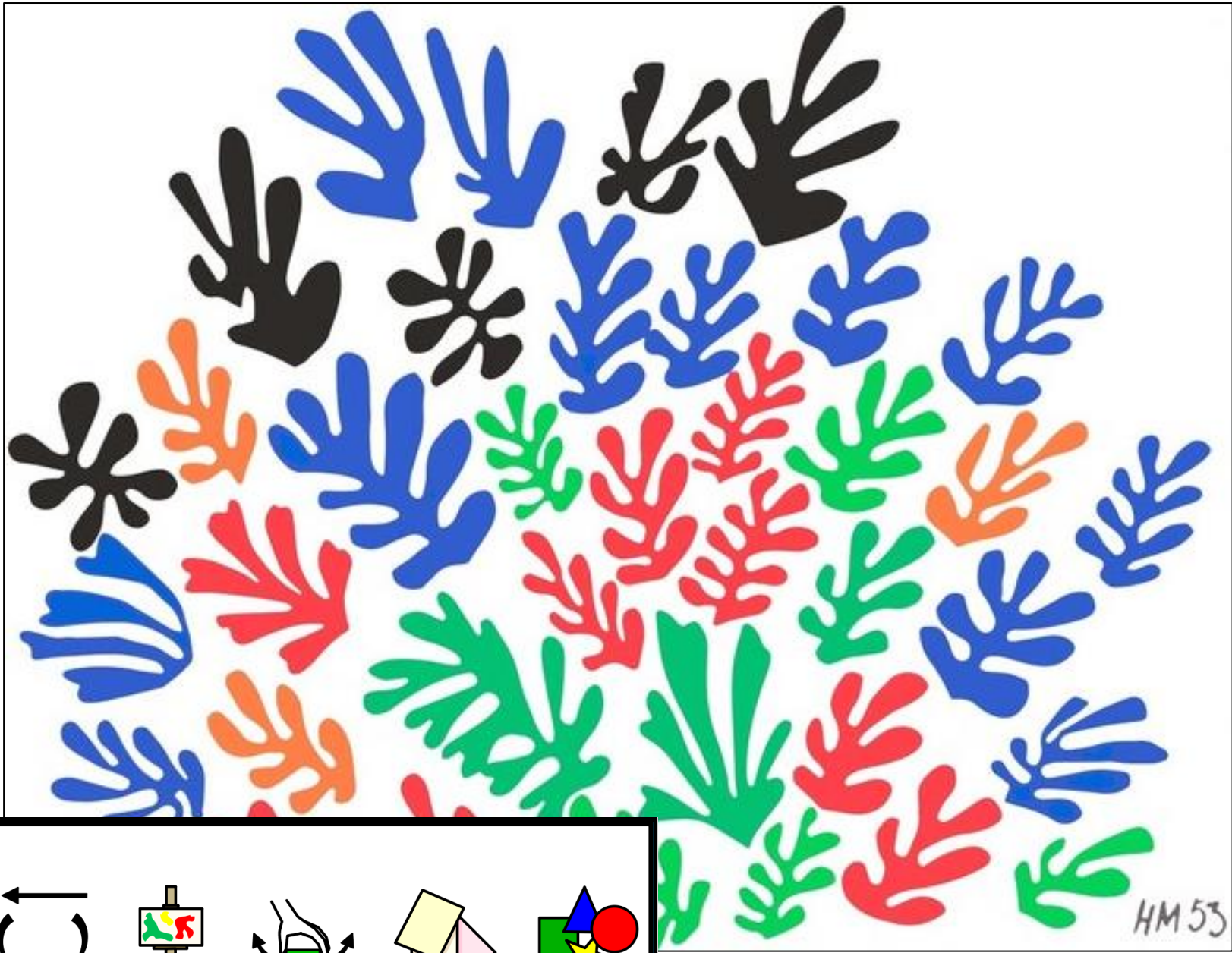
Extension ideas:

- What could you use other than paper to make your collage? Explore your house, garden or local park for ideas.

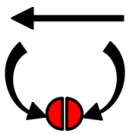
